A Journey of Growing: Olympics, Family, Passions, and More — What Really Matters

Missy Franklin is a five-time Olympic gold medalist and multiple world record-holder in the sport of swimming. Franklin became a household name during the 2012 Olympic Games in London when she won four gold medals and one bronze medal, becoming one of the most decorated athletes of the Games. She followed her Olympic success by winning six gold medals at the 2013 FINA World Championships in Barcelona, becoming the most-decorated female swimmer in history at a single World Championships. Most recently, she started the Unfiltered Waters Podcast with olympic champion, Katie Hoff.

Over the past 7 years, he managed operations while the brand pivoted business models, grew e-commerce sales from zero to \$250k monthly, opened 9 scoop shops, and built an in house manufacturing plant that makes pints of cookie dough for major retailers.

Sam is 9 steps into his 12 step recovery program from being a lawyer...forgiveness is hard for a lawyer to find. He has been involved in 14 different start up companies with no exit that he can brag about, but with a record that is not unlike most entrepreneurs: 4 exits at a profit, 5 exits that were breakeven, and 4 exits that were, let's say, ugly. Currently, he is CEO/Chairman of the Board of purGenix, the home of pūrHospitals® which you will love because it's like infections can't live there any more and, importantly, it reduces the carbon footprint with 15-25% building energy savings. Oh, he owns an environmental consulting firm, too, where he is Chairman of the Board.

Founding in Nashville: What It Looks Like to Start Your Own Company

Aabesh De is the founder of Flora, the all-in-one platform for consumer plant care. His journey began with the loss of his mother's 4-year old rose bush plant, which he sadly killed in just 10 short days. He set out to find tools that could help his horticultural hopelessness, but couldn't find a reliable go-to platform to monitor, track, and treat his plants. He realized that his problem was not uncommon, and yet there was no common solution. This began the journey of Flora, where he taught himself DIY electronics and Swift programming in order to create the Flora app and Flora Pod - a smart IoT plant sensor. In just 2 years, Flora has grown to over 300,000 users across 190 countries, and supports the care of over a million plants.

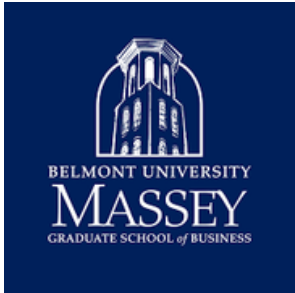
